This will be a busy month for all of Wolfe Pointe. We start with a long list of high school and college graduations, followed by the opening of the pool. What do these items have in common? They bring a LOT more traffic to the roads in Wolfe Pointe. This coupled with more families in the area will put many more pedestrians on the roads between homes and the pool / tennis courts area. I ask that each and every one take just an extra minute or two every time they travel to ensure no one gets hurt. With the pool opening at the end of May, we must all refresh ourselves on the pool rules and proper etiquette while using the pool. Little things will help Wolfe Pointe save money; not standing on the chairs, not putting the furniture in the pool, putting the umbrellas down when

done, just to name a few, help us all.

Tennis Courts – The tennis courts started cracking over the winter. The vender who resurfaced the courts was contacted. He examined the courts and found that the screen used to fill the cracks is defective and is splitting apart. He said that this is fully covered by his guarantee and that he will perform the repair when the temperature remains over 50 degrees 24 hours a day. I will let you know when this work is scheduled.

Roads and Grounds – With the spring planting season in full swing, we want to remind our residents and their landscape contractors to avoid locating any new plantings in roadside ditches or in any defined outfall swales around the neighborhood. These are our primary stormwater conveyance channels, and they need to be kept clear for runoff to flow freely to our main discharge points. In addition, please avoid planting trees and other vegetation around our streetlights and DEC transformers. Our street lighting network was upgraded last year. It is preferable to keep trees that could eventually mature and block the light source away from the fixtures. Plus, we need to ensure DEC can easily identify and access all transformers in the event of an emergency.

We will be getting a lot more visitors in the coming months. Remind younger drivers, friends and guests that on-street parking is allowed, but cars should remain on the asphalt pavement. Avoid parking on the grass areas adjacent to the road surface. This will help maintain our quality appearance, lessen grading and drainage (ponding) problems, and reduce the possibility of damage to irrigation heads near the edge of pavement.
